Registration Overview

What is Kids on Campus?

Kids on Campus is University Outreach Services’ annual summer enrichment program for youth currently in first through eighth grade. **Classes are offered on campus at Shawnee State University.** Area teachers and other community leaders design unique and fun classes specifically for this program. All students are well supervised, provided with exciting and educational activities, and have lots of fun!

When is Kids on Campus?

Kids on Campus will meet Monday June 25 – Thursday June 28, 2012. Each course will meet Monday through Thursday. Students may enroll in one, two, or all three of the course sessions. Courses will be offered at three times throughout each day according to the following schedule:

Session 1 - 9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. Monday – Thursday

Session 2 - 10:30 a.m. – 12:00 a.m. Monday – Thursday

LUNCH - 12:00 – 12:30 p.m. Monday – Thursday

Session 3 - 12:30 p.m. – 2:00 p.m. Monday – Thursday

How do I Register?

Registration is simple. You may register by phone, with your Discover, MasterCard, or Visa (740.351.3274), fax your registration to (740.351.3598), stop in our office to register in person, or mail your registration form to University Outreach Services, Shawnee State University, 940 Second Street Portsmouth, OH 45662. Office hours are Monday – Friday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. Register early – classes fill quickly!

Are there Special Discounts?

- **Kids on Campus** offers special discounts for registering early. The **Holiday Special** course fee is **\$40.00** per four-day course. Purchase Certificates **before 5:00 p.m. January 31, 2012** and pay only **\$40.00** per course. Certificates can be purchased prior to course selection and registration.
- The **Early Bird** registration fee is only **\$45.00** per course. Register any time between February 1 and **before 5:00 p.m. March 31, 2012** to receive the **Early Bird** registration fee of only **\$45.00** per course.
- The **Registration** fee is **\$55.00** per course. Register between April 1, and **before 5:00 p.m. May 31, 2012**, to receive the **Registration** fee of **\$45.00** per course.
- The **Late Registration** fee is **\$70.00** per course. Register between June 1, and **before 5:00 p.m. June 24, 2012**, to receive the **Late Registration** fee of **\$70.00** per course.
- On-site registration on the first day of the program is **\$75.00** per course.

Will I Receive a Confirmation?

Yes, a confirmation with your child’s schedule will be mailed to you before **Kids on Campus** begins.

What are the Lunch Arrangements?

Students staying through lunch time may either bring their own lunch or request a lunch each day. The fee for the provided lunch is \$25.00 per student for the entire four-day program.

Safety and Program Guidelines

Before Classes Begin

- For safety reasons a completed emergency medical form must accompany the registration. **Shawnee State University reserves the right to delay the student's registration until an emergency form is provided.**
- Register your children for the grade level they are currently in. This is the grade they must have completed by June 25, 2012. **Kids on Campus** accepts students who have attended **grade one** or older. We cannot accommodate students who have completed only Kindergarten.
- Students are encouraged to bring their own water (no milk products please, they will spoil).
- Children should wear comfortable play clothes that can get messy and are easily cleaned. Please dress in layers! Some classrooms are very chilly and the outdoor temperature will range from chilly in the morning to hot in the afternoon.
- Remind your children not to bring games, toys, trading cards, electronic devices, or similar materials to classes unless the instructor has requested them to do so. Shawnee State University is not responsible for lost, broken, or missing items.
- Inform your children about the classes they are taking, the lunch arrangements, and who will provide transportation.
- Talk with your children about safety issues in all public places such as **Kids on Campus**.

During Class Sessions

- Appropriate behavior is expected. Parents will be called, and students will be dismissed from the program for misbehavior.
- **Kids on Campus** staff and faculty members will not dispense medications as we are not properly trained or staffed to do so.

Dropping off Your Children

Each **Kids on Campus** student will receive a confirmation in the mail prior to the program. The drop-off location will be listed on the confirmation. During **Kids on Campus**, please arrive **5-10 minutes before** class start time so that your children will have the opportunity to attend the class in full. Drop your children off into the care of a Shawnee State University representative.

Picking up Your Children

The instructors will bring their students to the location in which you dropped them off in the morning (this location will be listed on your confirmation). You must pick your children up within 15 minutes of the end of class. An 'over-time' fee will be charged to parents more than 15 minutes late.

Refund & Cancellation Policies

Full refunds are given when a class is cancelled due to low enrollment or other unforeseen circumstances or the course requested is already filled. Students withdrawing from a class at least three full business days before the start date of a class will receive a full refund minus a 10% processing fee. No other refunds will be granted. Lunches are non-refundable after **June 22, 2012**.

University Outreach Services reserves the right to cancel courses when the enrollment is too low to make the course feasible. Participants who have registered for those courses will be given a full refund of fees paid or may transfer fees to another class in the same session.

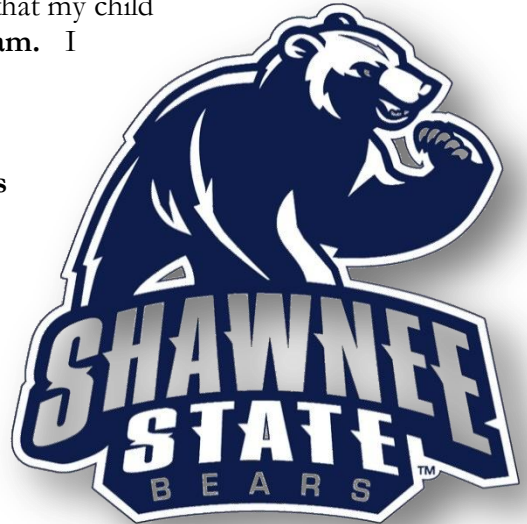
