Mr. Warren reported on the Academic and Student Affairs Committee informational items.

Mr. Warren reported that Ms. Jonica Burke, Registrar, reported on SSU graduation statistics. He said there were 560 graduates with 380 Bachelor Degrees and 202 Associate Degrees.

Mr. Warren said Dr. Dave Todt, Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, reported on faculty retirements. He acknowledged the following individuals:

Mr. Warren said Dr. Todt reported on the recent approval of the Bachelor of Science in Athletic Training by the Ohio Board of Regents.

Mr. Warren said Ms. Halea Hatton, President of the Student Government Association, reported on the activities of the SGA.

Mr. Warren noted that Dr. Jim Settle reported on Shawnee State University's Chapter of the National Honor Society Phi Eta Sigma's 2009 installation. He said there were 108 students inducted in the National Honor Society and in order to be inducted, students had to have a GPA of 3.5 or higher. Mr. Warren also said three honorary staff members were recognized.

Mr. Warren said Ms. Sarah Lowe, VISTA Volunteer, reported on the 2009 Alternative Spring Break and other projects. Mr. Warren said 22 students traveled to Mississippi to work on a Habitat for Humanity house project.

Mr. Warren said Mr. Jeff Hamilton, Interim Athletic Director and Head Men's Basketball Coach, reported on the Spring Bear Run/Walk held on April 22, 2009. He said there were 869 registrations with 509 participants finishing the race. Of those finishing the race, 194 were SSU students, 68 were alumni, 32 faculty and staff members and 14 Golden Bears. He noted that the Fall Bear Run/Walk will be held on September 23.

Finance and Facilities – Mr. Howard Harcha

Mr. Harcha thanked members of the Finance and Facilities Committee for their hard work and dedication and also thanked Dr. Morris, Ms. Boyles and Ms. Charles for their leadership.

Mr. Harcha reported on behalf of the Finance and Facilities Committee and said the Committee had three action items.

Mr. Harcha said the Finance and Facilities Committee recommended approval of Resolution F05-09, Alternative-Course Tuition Rate. Mr. Harcha said the alternative-course tuition rate is designated for selected courses and empowers the President to work with the Chancellor to ensure implementation. Mr. Harcha moved and Mr. Mooney seconded a motion to approve Resolution F05-09.

Mr. Harcha said the Finance and Facilities Committee recommended approval of Resolution 06-09, Tuition and Student Fees. Mr. Harcha said there are three factors to mention for the proposed AY09-10 semester tuition and fee schedule for undergraduate and graduate programs and miscellaneous fees. He said in 2007, the Board and student government committed to fund bonded indebtedness for the University Center renovation at a rate of \$150 per semester. Fall 2009 will be the first time that fee is assessed. Mr. Harcha said the second factor is that undergraduate tuition will stay at 0% as directed by the Chancellor and Governor, but graduate tuition would increase 3.5%. The third factor is that course credit by arrangement fee will need to change as the current \$30 fee does little to offset the cost of approximately \$150. Mr. Harcha moved and Mr. Coleman seconded a motion to approve Resolution 06-09.

Mr. Harcha said the Finance and Facilities Committee recommend approval of Resolution F07-09, Foundation Resolution. Mr. Harcha said the SSU Board is responsible for passing and approving policies for the Foundation. Approval of this resolution would amend Development Foundation Resolution 2009.1, Policy 7.1.2 concerning pledges. Mr. Harcha said this change would amend the accounting of when the value of a pledge is received. Mr. Harcha moved and Mr. Mooney seconded a motion to approve Resolution F07-09.

Mr. Harcha reported on the Finance and Facilities Committee informational items.

Mr. Harcha said in accordance with Policy 5.16Rev., the personnel appointments for the period February 25, 2009 to April 24, 2009 included three new faculty hires, one faculty resignation and one administration separation.

Mr. Harcha said that a possible discontinuation of the ABLE funding for the BASICS program effective June 30, 2009 may result in employment reductions.

Mr. Harcha also said that under H.B. 1, OACHE will not be fully funded by the Ohio Board of Regents after June 30, 2009 resulting in possible employment reductions/reassignments.

Mr. Harcha said Ms. Elinda Boyles, Vice President for Finance and Administration, reviewed the general fund revenues and expenditures Pace report, fiscal year to date through March 2009.

Mr. Harcha said Ms. Charles reviewed the fiscal year to date Pace report for fiscal year to date through March 2009 for the Vern Riffe Center for the Arts. Mr. Harcha said the VRCFA is in much better shape this year than last and said it was due in part to the hard work of Ms. Charles.

Mr. Harcha said Ms. Boyles reviewed the University's Investment activity as of April 2009. He noted that the investment portfolio for the University is suffering much the same as everything else given the economic climate.

Mr. Harcha said Mr. Boyles reviewed the capital status report which reflected current information on the major capital projects.

Mr. McCoy asked Mr. Warren, Chair of the Nominating Committee, to report on the Committee's recommendations for the 2009-2010 Board Officers. Mr. Warren said the Committee recommended Mr. McCoy to serve as Board Chair with Dr. Ball to serve as Vice Chair and made a motion for approval. President's Report to the Shawnee State University Board of Trustees
Friday, May 8, 2009

As the University continues to grow and our faculty and students venture into new areas, we change as an institution. Additionally, the social and political environment changes us. This report shares with you some of the changes.

Alcohol Initiative:

As you know, our Student Affairs staff has developed a comprehensive set of programming to provide our students with the tools to help them make responsible decisions about alcohol. As part of my own commitment to this program, I have agreed to serve as the honorary chair of the Ohio College Initiative to Reduce High-Risk Drinking through the Drug-Free Action Alliance. The Drug Free Action Alliance brings together more than 45 colleges and universities to form campus and community coalitions to reduce the environmental influences that condone or promote high-risk drinking. During the coming year, I will work with the Alliance staff to promote good practices and bring awareness to this important aspect of student life.


Athletics Conference:

At a recent meeting I told you about pending changes in the American Mideast Conference and the efforts I had directed to investigate alternative conferences for our intercollegiate athletic programming. After discussion with our Faculty Athletic Representative, coaches, the university-wide Intramural and Athletics Committee, and representatives from several conferences, Director of Athletics, Jeff Hamilton, and Vice President for Student Affairs, Jim Settle, have recommended that we move to the NAIA America Mid South Conference effective the 2010-2011 academic year. The institutions in this conference are in Kentucky, West Virginia, and Virginia which will require less travel and missed class time for our teams. The Commissioner from the Mid South visited the campus recently and made a strong case for our joining the Conference. I have decided to accept the recommendation and have begun to process to make the change.

Appalachian Studies Conference:

Approximately 600 people were in attendance, including Governor Strickland, on Saturday of the conference. Ginnie Moore and her staff in University Outreach Services did a good job working and coordinating things with the conference organizers. Those in attendance spoke very highly of the facilities and the conference in general.

Congratulations to the following staff and faculty members who presented during the conference: Barb Bradbury, John Simon, Mandy Hart, Barb Kunkle, Andrew Feight, Michael Barnhart, Neil Carpathios and Brenda Haas. Also a special thanks to the following students who presented poetry with Dr. Carpathios, they are Katie Kaltenbach, Ammie Phipps, Kat Collins, Barbara Wilson-Battles and Cassaundra Mootz.

Articulation Agreement:

Shawnee State recently signed articulation agreements with Ashland Community and Technical College. These agreements will allow students who follow the degree requirements in several areas of study to move from the two-year community college at ACTC into a four-year program at SSU in pursuit of a bachelor's degree. The agreements include Bachelor of Arts degrees in History, Psychology, Sociology, and International Relations and Bachelor of Science degrees in Computer Engineering Technology and Environmental Engineering Technology.

Celebration of Scholarship:

April saw the fifth annual Celebration of Scholarship, directed by Professor Shannon Lawson. This annual undergraduate conference highlights the scholarly, creative and research activities of our students. This year the Deans of both colleges provided cash prizes for students who presented exceptional papers during this year's celebration. The following students each received \$100 for their scholastic achievement: Courtney Butts, Bethany Heidenreich, Jed Baily, Deborah Bankhead, Lisa Anderson and Brandi Norris.

Evening of Honors:

Seventy-one students, faculty and staff were honored on April 17 for their academic accomplishments during this special evening. Congratulations to all of the award recipients and congratulations to Orville Ferguson, this year's Bear Hug winner. The Bear Hug award is considered the university's most important award because it is an award that is nominated and voted on by the students.

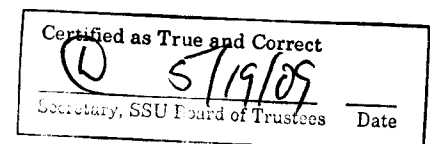

Veterans Services:

In response to the increased resources being made available to Gulf War veterans and their families by the Federal and Ohio governments, the University is developing a single-point-of-contact office for veterans enrolling or attending SSU. The Office of Veterans Services will have information on programming and services and will facilitate as veterans work with the admissions and financial aid office. These services will be integrated into the Office of Career Planning.

RESOLUTION ASA 05-09

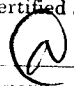
APPROVAL OF GRADUATES
