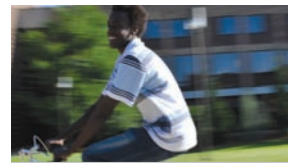

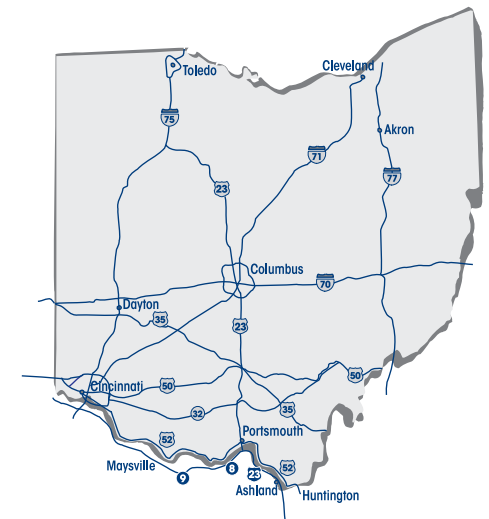

Take I-77S to I-70W. Take I-70W to I-270S (Columbus). Take I-270S to Rt. 23S. Take Rt. 23S to Third St. in Portsmouth. Turn left on Third St.

### ... from Ashland, Ky.

Take Rt. 23N to the U. S. Grant Bridge. Turn right on Third St.

### ... from Cincinnati

Take Rt. 32E to Rt. 23S. Stay on Rt. 23 to Third St. in Portsmouth. Turn left on Third St.

### ... from Cleveland

Take I-71S. At Columbus, take 270S. Take Rt. 23S to Third St. in Portsmouth. Turn left on Third St.

### ... from Columbus

Take Rt. 23S to Third St. in Portsmouth. Turn left on Third St.

### ... from Dayton

Take Rt. 35S to Rt. 23S. Stay on Rt. 23 to Third St. in Portsmouth. Turn left on Third St.

### ... from Huntington, W. Va.

Take Rt. 52W to Rt. 23S in Portsmouth. Stay on Rt. 23 to Third St. Turn left on Third St.

### ... from Maysville, Ky.

Take Rt. 9E to Rt. 8E. Take Rt. 8E to the U. S. Grant Bridge (23N). Turn right on Third St.

### ... from Toledo

Take I-75S to Rt. 23 (Findlay). At Columbus, take 270S. Take Rt. 23S to Third St. in Portsmouth. Turn left on Third St.
