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# Welcome to the AP\* Summer Institute at Shawnee State University, Portsmouth, Ohio!

If you currently teach or are planning to teach high school Advanced Placement\* classes, register now for the AP Summer Institute at Shawnee State University. The AP Summer Institutes are subject-specific professional development opportunities that provide teachers with the support and training needed to teach AP courses and to utilize Pre-AP\* teaching strategies.

Workshops planned for 2012 are: AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP English Literature & Composition, AP Psychology and AP U.S. History. There is space available for thirty participants per workshop. Workshops will be held Monday through Thursday on campus from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Lunch will be on your own. Continental breakfast and refreshments will be available daily.

## Workshops and Consultants

### Biology

Isidore Julien

Isidore Julien has been a reader for the AP Biology exam for the past 20 years, serving the last 6 years as a Table Leader. He has served as an AP Biology consultant for the past 16 years for the APSI summer institutes at Purdue University.

AP Biology Summer Institute is an intense week long summer institute surveying the new AP Biology curriculum. Selected content areas of the AP Biology curriculum will be highlighted. Participants engage in hands-on investigative laboratory activities covering the major AP recommended labs. In addition participants learn how to start an AP biology program at their school including the selection of students. Information on the AP Biology exam will be provided including the AP course audit and the scoring methods employed.

### Chemistry

AP Chemistry offers you, the new AP Chemistry teacher the tools and strategies needed to build a successful AP Chemistry program in your high school. The Institute provides an opportunity to experience some of the recommended labs for AP Chemistry, with time for discussion. Participants should bring a calculator and goggles and wear appropriate lab apparel.

David Fawcett teaches Chemistry and AP Chemistry in Columbus, Ohio where he also serves as a College Board Consultant. He is an experienced AP Reader and AP workshop leader.

### English Literature & Composition

Betsy Cussler

Betsy Cussler taught all levels of English/Language Arts for 35 years. She has designed AP curricula, taught AP several years at Edina High School in Minnesota, and graded the AP Literature exams for many years.

This four-day workshop concentrates on some essential strategies (the teacher's) and skills (the students'): how to teach and write about poetry,

prose, fiction and drama; how to improve student writing using their own papers as the "text"; how to structure homework and writing assignments with respect for both the teacher's and the students' time. The focus is on Advanced Placement but the strategies are valid at pre-AP levels.

### Psychology

Allison Herzig is a high school teacher in Northern Virginia and has taught AP Psychology for 13 years. She is a long-time AP Exam reader and table leader and works with ETS to write test items for the Praxis Exam. Allison has led College Board summer institutes and one-and two-day workshops for both experienced and novice psychology teachers for over 10 years. She recognizes the unique needs of social studies certified teachers being asked to teach a science-based curriculum, thus the core component of her week-long summer institutes is content-based. Teachers attending the summer institute can expect to come away with pacing guides, content lectures, and useful and meaningful activities for the advanced classroom.

### U.S. History

John Struck

John has been teaching AP US history for 25 years, at the Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology in Fairfax County, Virginia for the last 17. He has served as a consultant for the College Board for ten years — mainly in the Southern Region — and has led summer institutes in Fairfax County, VA; Lexington, KY; Oakland, MI; Savannah, GA; and Tampa, FL. John is also a mentor for College Board consultants and has been an AP reader for nine years. Along with teaching AP US history, John also teaches honors US/Virginia history and Honors 20th-century world history. John's main interests in U.S. history are the early 18th century and the time period between 1920 and 1960. He is a member of SHEAR (Society of Historians of the Early American Republic).

The U.S. History workshop covers College Board policy relevant to advanced placement courses, how to set up and pace a course, best practices, and the sharing of lesson ideas by the participants.

## The Workshops

Topics that are often covered in summer institute sessions include:

- AP\* courses: goals, objectives, content, resources, bibliographies, and equipment
- The AP Examination: how it is developed and graded
- Syllabi, lesson plans, and assignments
- How to refresh and improve existing AP courses
- Recent changes in AP course descriptions
- Strategies for teaching students at beginning or intermediate levels
- AP Vertical teams\*

Participants will receive hand-outs and other materials for use in their AP classrooms, as well as valuable networking connections with other teachers and expert consultants.

## Daily Schedule

The APSI week is intense and the consultants cover an enormous amount of material in a very short amount of time. In order to be fully prepared to teach AP courses, participants will be required to attend every session (all 32 hours of instruction). Full participation is required in order to complete the Institute or to receive the graduate workshop credit.
